

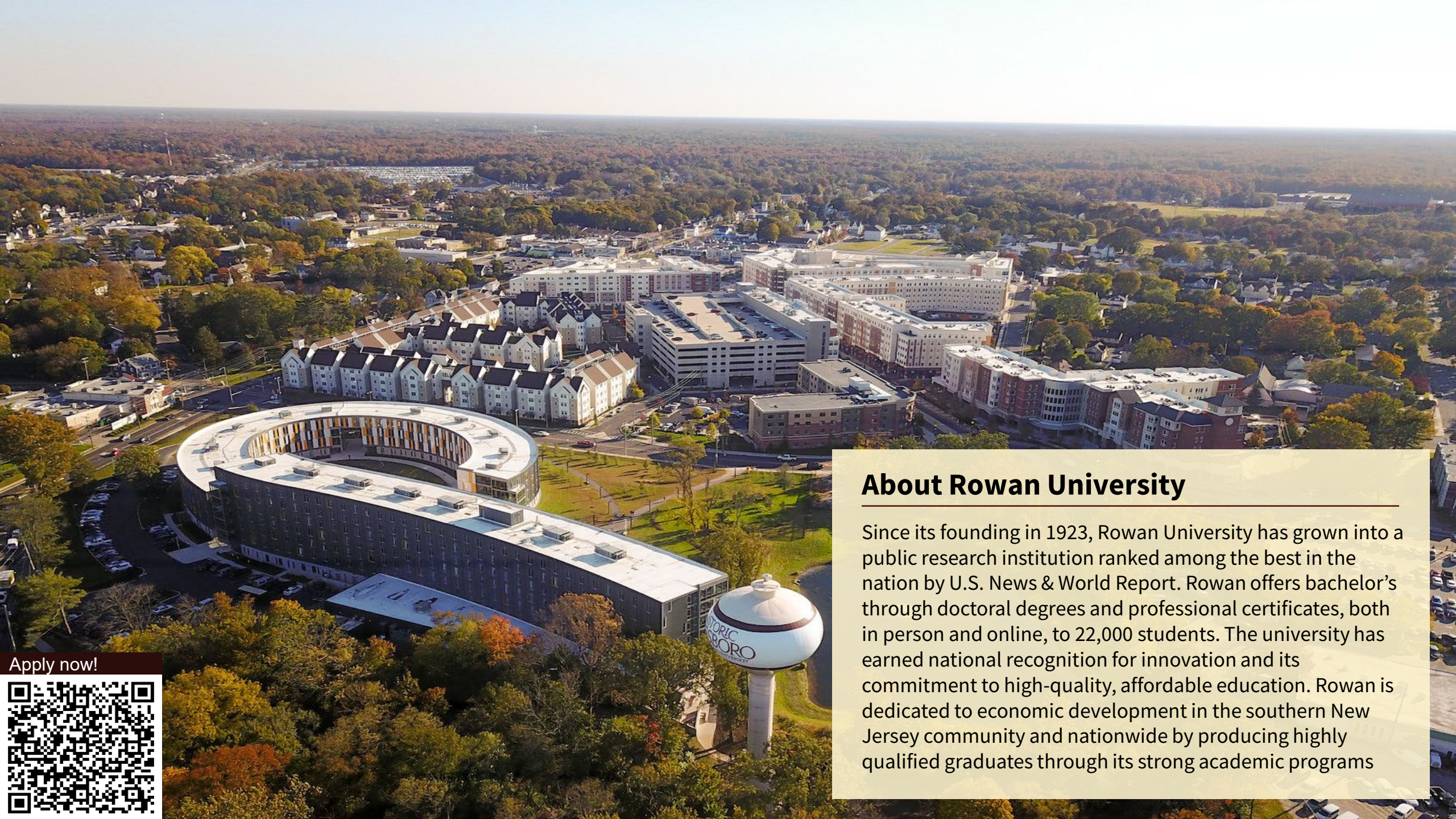

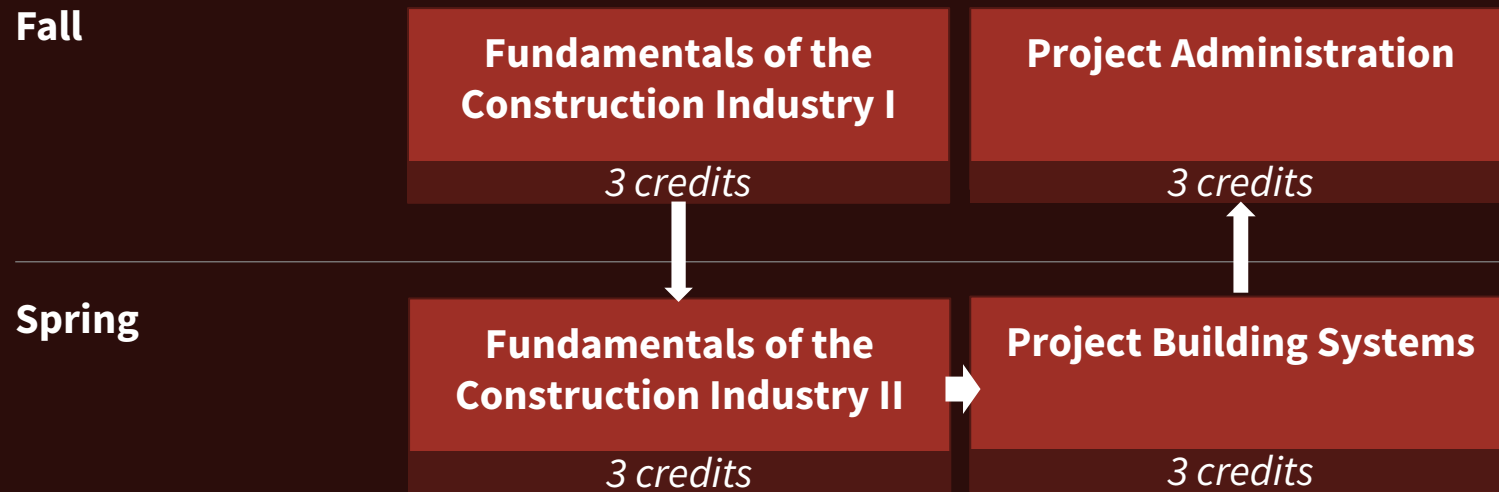
Certificate	Course	Example application on the job
Construction Management 	Fundamentals of the Construction Industry I	Host and lead a safety toolbox talk: Effectively communicate safety procedures to a group, fostering proactive safety culture and encouraging discussion
	Fundamentals of the Construction Industry II	Assist stakeholder coordination: Collaborate with project owners, engineers, and subcontractors to ensure project success and adherence to contract requirements
	Project Building Systems	Support environmental system design: Discuss site environmental considerations and strategize on best practices in design and comfort installations
	Project Administration	Develop a work breakdown structure (WBS): Define components of the WBS, analyze dependencies between different packages, and ensure alignment on milestones

Non-affiliated student journey

- 1 Student hears about program and visits webpage
- 2 Student fills in an interest form
- 3 Student talks to advisors to determine eligibility
- 4 Student creates an account on the Rowan portal
- 5 Student submits application along with application fees, resume, and essays

- 1 Your union will provide Rowan University with your application material
- 2 You receive application login details to activate your account
- 3 You finalize and submit your pre-filled application by uploading proof of union affiliation and high school transcript



What do next steps look like? To begin the application process...

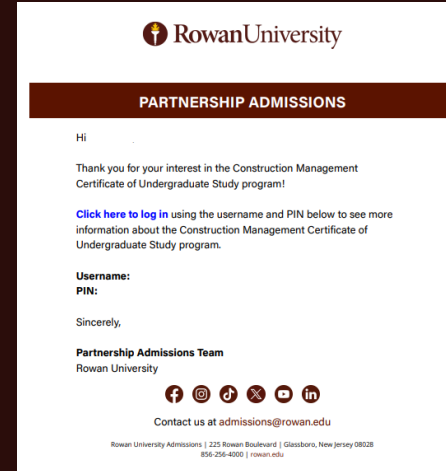


1. Scan the barcode

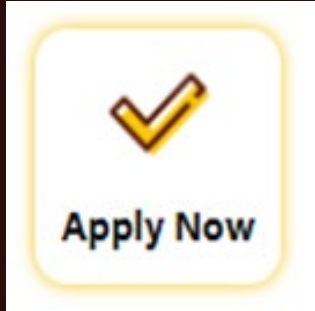
You will need to finalize and submit your application which includes uploading

- High school diploma or unofficial transcript or GED score report

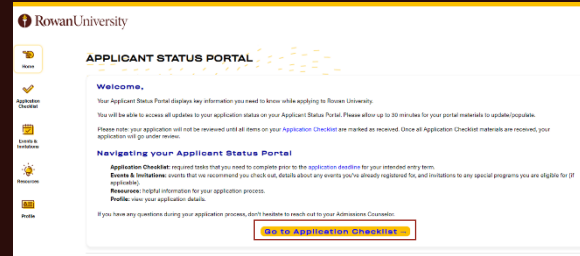

To finalize your application...

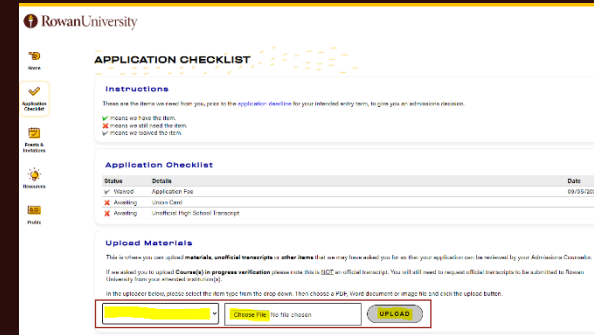


1. Log in to the partnership portal using the username and PIN provided to you by email and click the 'Apply Now' button



2. You will receive an email with a link to access your Applicant Status Portal where you will need to submit any remaining requirements. Navigate to your Application Checklist Portal

Note: all required checklist items must be submitted before the application deadline in order to receive an Admissions decision



3. Go to the Upload Materials Section

Upload a copy of your union card and unofficial high school transcript, diploma, or GED score report

Note: Please allow up to 30 minutes after submitting your application for your portal materials to populate. Your application fee will be waived.

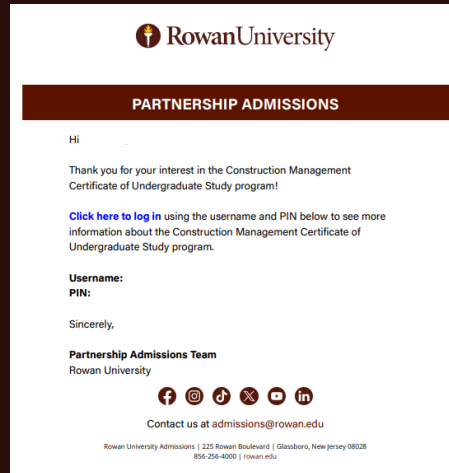
Once your application is complete, a member of our team will review your application and make an admission decision

You will receive an email when your application has been reviewed and it is time to accept your offer of admission

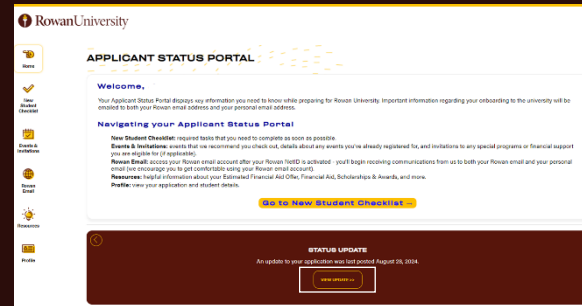

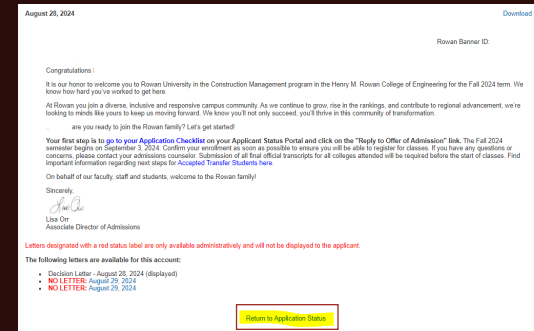
To view and accept your offer of admission...



1. Log in to your account



2. Navigate to your Applicant Status Portal and select View Update (in the brown status bar at the bottom of the page)



3. Review your Decision Letter and then select Return to Application Status

When you return to the Application Status page, you will view a new option to accept your offer of admission.

Once this step is complete, you are officially a Rowan University student!

Frequently asked questions about Rowan University's Construction Management Certificate



When does the program start?

The program starts on October 29th, 2024

When do I need to apply by?

The application deadline is October 15th, 2024; however, we recommend applying sooner rather than later

What is the cost of the certificate program?

Local 420 students have a discounted rate of \$445 / credit for the construction management certificate. The entire certificate program would cost \$5340

How long does it take to complete?

The program will take one year to complete if you take 2 courses a semester. Each course is only 7 weeks long so you would not be enrolled in 2 courses at the same time

What do I need to apply?

Local 420 members have a simplified application process. You just need proof of union affiliation and a high school diploma or GED score report or unofficial transcript. The application should take under 10 minutes to complete. Once admitted, you will be asked to submit an official transcript unless you submitted a GED score report

What if I am interested in the Bachelor's degree in Construction Management?

Please scan the QR code, select the 'Bachelors in Construction Management' and fill out the form. You will receive log in details to a portal where you can apply
